## Record of Trinity's Clergy

In the 1800's, because Harford County was a rural area, it was served by a traveling minister or a missionary if there wasn't a full-time pastor. Distances between congregations were very far with no transportation other than the horse and buggy. Records from that time are not completely available and so we have relied on the memories of older Trinity members and documents in our Trinity archives. Therefore, spelling of names or initials may vary during this period. Trinity feels that this is the most correct and up-to-date list we have.



**George Geiser** – 1872-1873 - Pastor Geiser walked 15 miles along the railroad tracks every Sunday from Stemmers Run to Magnolia and then on to Trinity to conduct an afternoon service in German.

**H.L. Burry** – 1881-1882 – Listed as pastor at Perryman, Harford County. Records indicate two missions for Burry when he was called in 1881.

**R.A. Kudell** – 1883-1893 – First full-time pastor of the first official Lutheran building in Harford County, established in 1873.

**J.E.A. Doermann** – 1885-1887 – Doermann was pastor in 1886 when St. Paul's Church erected a new building at Perryman, Maryland. It was during his pastorate that the two congregations, Trinity and St. Paul's, were officially recognized as forming the Harford County Lutheran Parish.

These early years of the congregation, for both members and pastors, were struggling ones. Farming was the principal vocation, and job opportunities and money were scarce. The pastors did all they could do to serve the congregation.

- **R.E.M.** Engers 1888 Ordained in 1882 by the Eastern District. Ordained in April 1888 by the Concordia District. He only served two months on this call.
- G.R. Wannemacher 1890-1896 Installed on July 20, 1890, to take over the charge vacated by Engers. In 1891, he made a commitment to the District to personally find and raise contributions for missions. His own charge (Trinity and St. Paul's) pledged \$90 to the new orphans' home in Richmond, Indiana.
- **J.C. Twele** 1897 Ordained in 1897, he went directly to Trinity but resigned without call.
- **C.F. Mechling** 1898-1907 He lived in Abingdon so he could serve both congregations, St. Paul's and Trinity.

W.E. Harsh – June 2, 1907-1910 – Capital University (1891) in Columbus, OH

C.G. Wolf – 1910-1913 – Capital University in Columbus, OH. Written in his Call was this instruction: "To preach in both languages, English and German." Also inserted was the statement, "Pastor to furnish his own horse and buggy," which was his major means of visitation. The congregation showed considerable growth both financially and in membership.


**R.C. Sieberg** – July 6, 1913-1922 – Pastor

On March 22, 1922, a call was extended by the congregations at Joppa and Aberdeen to a senior student at the Theological Seminary in Columbus, Ohio.

#### W. Edward Austin

- ♦ Established the Mission of Bethel Lutheran Church in North East, MD in the late 1940's/early 1950's.
- ♦ After 40 years of service, he retired and was named Pastor Emeritus in 1963 and also served as Visitation Pastor, School Bus driver and Substitute Teacher until 1976.



#### **Pastor Spotlight**

In the mid-1950's as the congregation grew, the need for additional staff became obvious. In June 1955, theological student John H. S. Austin, son of Edward Austin, became the second Intern at Trinity. In April 1956, Pastor John was called as a second full-time pastor in the Harford County Lutheran Parish.

He was ordained and Installed on July 16, 1989, on the 67<sup>th</sup> anniversary of his grandfather's Installation as Assistant Pastor of Trinity Lutheran Church.




#### **Pastor Spotlight**
